Mathcounts State Competition Concludes with Surprising Results

In Wisconsin, NSPE-WI, sponsors the Mathcounts competition. The Competition Series typically has four levels of competition - school, chapter, state and national. However, this year the 2020-2021 Competition Series had a different four levels of official competition—chapter, chapter invitational, state and national. Due to Covid, the competition online with only the Sprint and Target Rounds. The Team and Countdown Rounds typically held as in previous years could not be held this year due to the closing of schools and social distancing requirements.

In total, 108 students participated in the 2021 Chapter Competition statewide, which was held online February 5-6, 2021. Coaches at the schools determined which students participated in the Chapter Competition. Each student competed solely as an individual; there was no team competition due to Covid restrictions.

Advancing from the Chapter Competition to the Chapter Individual Invitational were five students from Velma Hamilton of Madison, four from Kromrey Middle School of Middleton, two each from Eagle School of Madison and Glacier Creek of Middleton and one each from Madison Country Day School of Waunakee and Glacial Drumlin of Cottage Grove.

The top scoring student from each school and additionally the next top individuals from each chapter advanced to the 2021 Chapter Invitational Competition, which took place online February 25. Each student that advanced to this level was required to take the competition at the same time online competing as an individual. Angelina Chang of Hamilton bested Harry Jin of Kromrey by a mere two points in the individual competition for first place.

The top 42 students from throughout the State from the Chapter Competitions advanced to the 2021 State Competition, held online March 25. Every student that advanced to this level was required to take the competition at the same time. Each student competed solely as an individual, again, due to Covid restrictions. Nine students from this local chapter competition advanced to the state, including three each from Velma Hamilton and Kromrey Middle Schools, two from Eagle School and one from Madison Country Day School.

The State Competition produced surprising results as for the first time in years the students that will be representing Wisconsin in the National Competition will have only one person from the Middleton/Madison area, Harry Jin of Kromrey Middle School. He will be joined by two students from Wisconsin Hills Middle School in Brookfield and one student from DePere Middle School. Usually, Madison and recently Middleton would dominate the State Competition. These four students will represent the State team for the National Competition. The State competition was extremely close with only four points separating the top eleven students. This necessitated the use of tie breakers to determine the final ranking. The National competition results will be posted on our State website, wspe.org, as of this weekend.

- Join the National Society of Professional Engineers (NSPE)!
 It is free of charge to students and you gain valuable networking and education opportunities.

Your NSPE membership automatically enrolls you in the state society and chapter based on your preferred mailing address. You can begin enjoying benefits and networking right away!


- Find employment that will help you gain experience towards achieving professional registration!
- Look for an employer that provides the opportunity to work under and be supervised by registered Professional Engineers.

This is important because you need to have registered Professional Engineers provide references for you to satisfy PE registration requirements. (See footnote)

- Complete four years of qualifying engineering experience, typically under the supervision of a Professional Engineer.
- Continue your involvement with NSPE and take advantage of leadership and volunteer opportunities at the chapter, state, and national levels.

NSPE dues will increase at 20% per year from \$0 student to full price to help you financially ease into a full dues paying member!

Footnote: In Wisconsin, the references have to be from at least five (5) individuals having personal knowledge of the applicant's engineering work, three (3) or more of whom are registered Professional Engineers, and at least one (1) of whom has served as supervisor in responsible charge of the applicant's engineering work. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services' Professional Engineer Section suggests the person completing the reference form should have 12 months' knowledge of the applicant's engineering experience within the past five (5) years.





Next Exit: Apply for Licensure

• TAKE THE PE OR SE EXAM

(NOTE: Either exam can be taken at any time, but you must complete four years of qualifying work experience before applying for licensure)

- Find Exam Dates and register for either the NCEES Principles and Practices of Engineering exam or the NCEES Structural Engineering exam at: https://ncees.org/engineering/pe/
- NSPE also sponsors an excellent PE Review Refresher Correspondence Course. There are other courses and practice exams available at: https://nspe.org/resources/education/exam-review-and-preparation It is suggested to start preparing/studying for the exam three months prior to the exam date.
 - Once you pass the exam, submit your application for licensure with the Wisconsin Department of Safety & Professional Services - https://dsps.wi.gov/pages/Professions/EngineerProfessional/Default.aspx





- Most states, including Wisconsin, require continuing professional development as a condition of professional license renewal.
- NSPE-WI hosts an annual Discovery Conference to provide PDHs with a local flavor. Get involved with the planning, then join your colleagues to enjoy a diverse program with networking and socializing!
- Your NSPE membership entitles you to 15 free Professional Development Hours (PDH) per year.
 NSPE also offers numerous webinars and conferences, including the annual NSPE PE Conference, providing ample opportunities to fulfill PDH requirements and network with colleagues around the country.
